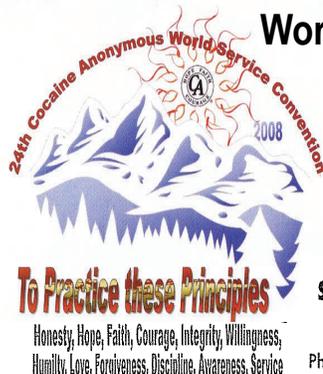

Step Five: Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.

It's hard for me to write about my fifth step without writing about my fourth. I did my fourth step all at once. I did it the way it is described in the Big Book. I just kept writing until it was all done. It really helped me open my eyes to all of my character defects.

After I was done, my sponsor sat down and read the fifth step with me out of the Big Book. He then asked me if I wanted to do my fifth step with him or someone else. Of course I wanted to do this step with my sponsor! I was very nervous, but I knew I was going through this process with someone I could trust.

As I read through my fourth step, I began to understand why it

is important to read this to someone else. There were things about myself that I did not realize and there were parts of my life that were somewhat delusional. I was talking about things that I did not want to remember, much less let anyone else know about, yet here I was sharing these experiences.

An unexpected thing happened while I was doing this. I found out that I was not so unique. My situations and experiences were not much different than a lot of other peoples'. I no longer felt so different and alone. There was a great freedom in that!

Armed with a list of defects from my inventory, I started my sixth and seventh steps. Something

was very different now though. I had a whole new confidence. I could look people in the eyes without feeling less than or greater than anybody else. I was not on the outside looking in anymore. I was a part of a much larger whole, and I realized how unnecessary all of my fear had been.

Step Six: Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.

Willingness is the key! It is mentioned many times in both the Big Book and Twelve and Twelve. After doing step four, a searching moral inventory of myself, and step five, admit to God and another human being the exact nature of my wrongs, you bet I was ready to change!

I learned in steps four and five that drugs were a small part of my problem. I was an addict whose problem was Troy. But *how* was I to change? "You can't, but God can," my sponsor told me. I had to want to change and I had to be willing to change. When this felt

difficult, I was told to pray and ask God for willingness.

I saw people in the rooms of C.A. who had something that I wanted. They were happy, joyous and free! Seeing them helped me to become willing to "let go and let God" remove these defects of character which stood in my way of being useful to God and others. Bring on step seven!
